District Honored Guest

Founders Day 2016's District Honored Guest is Director of Facilities and Operations Dave Bell. Dave came to the district 13 years ago, beginning his career as head custodian at the high school in 2002. Just four years later, his work ethic was recognized and he was promoted to assistant director of facilities and operations. Dave became Director of Facilities and Operations when the position became available in 2008, and has since put his stamp on countless enhancements, facelifts, beautification projects, undertakings, renovations, repairs, upkeep and maintenance. He sits on both the Efficiency Committee and Safety Committee and holds vocational certificates in heating, ventilation and air conditioning from Nassau Technical and Electrical I and Electrical II from Wilson Technical.

"It gives me great pride to have my hard work and dedication to the district appreciated and recognized," Dave said.

"Dave had the courage to take this giant leap [in 2008 to his current position]," Founders Day Chairperson Irene Carlomusto said. "The district encompasses 11 buildings, vast acreage, and a facilities staff between 80 and 100

employees. That entails a great deal of responsibility and requires significant and diverse skills, leadership and knowledge. Dave was willing to not only take on these challenges, but to also accept the responsibility and commitment to learn on the job. The district was fortunate that Dave was in the right



place at the right time, and that he has been so willing to embrace the challenges of this significant position. He is most deserving of PTA recognition for his work and commitment."

Dave's favorite memory of Hicksville is first being hired by the district and then working to advance himself, which he accomplished by working tirelessly and challenging himself. 
