
Olin College of Engineering in Massachusetts.

Nassau County Police Commissioner Patrick Ryder served as the keynote speaker, sharing how he served as student body president of his own graduating class and his personal stories of growing up, attending college and later ascending through the ranks of the police department.

"You define who you will be!" he reminded the

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
