What does Co-Teaching look like?




Co-teaching is a collaborative approach to instruction in which two teachers, a general education teacher and a special education teacher, work together to plan and then implement instruction for a class that includes students with disabilities.

The co-teaching team has a **shared vision and goals**.







Co-teachers refer to students as "our students." Both teachers are acknowledged on classroom doors, information that goes home to families and on report cards. The special education teacher and general education teacher cannot be distinguished in the class. **Both are equal partners, facilitators and contributors.**

Both teachers **regularly team teach**, **work with students with and without disabilities**, **communicate with families** of students with and without disabilities and **take turns leading class instruction**.

Flexibility and adaptations within the classroom is supported by both teachers.

Current Elementary Co-Teaching Model GLOWS

- School leaders identified the high quality of educators, professional partnerships between co-teachers and care for students as universal assets.
- The district is committed to supporting co-teachers in shared professional experiences and learning. Example: Fountas and Pinnell for all teachers in grades K-2 for 2022-2023.
- 100% of classrooms visited provided a positive, caring environment that addressed varied needs of students.




Current Elementary Co-Teaching Model GLOWS

The district has committed to maintaining co-teaching teams, to the greatest extent possible, to support professional partnerships in their continued learning and growth.







Current Elementary Co-Teaching Model GROWS

- The district is committed to supporting co-teachers in shared professional experiences and learning. Example: Fountas and Pinnell will be expanded for all teachers in grades 3-5 for 2023-2024.
- The district is committed to developing a set schedule or system of co-planning for co-teaching teams. Planning and preparation for a co-teaching team is essential for a successful partnership in the classroom for teachers and students.
- The district is working towards professional learning and building commitments with a focus on Specially Designed Instruction within Integrated Co-Teaching classrooms.
 - Specially Designed Instruction includes:
 - co-planning and collective responsibility for student learning
 - □ support co-planning: time, structure, coaching, monitoring
 - monitor student learning using data

How to Use Data to Drive Instruction


- \star Look for trends in the data to plan class lessons.
- \star Look at individual scores to form small groups.
- * Remember that you know your students better than any test.
- \star Collect additional data on a regular basis.
- \star Share the results with your students.
- Professional Development for fine arts teachers through PLC (Professional Learning Communities)
- Special Olympics will be supporting and training all physical education teachers on strategies and adaptations to the curriculum
- > NWEA assessments, F&P benchmarking, Math Monthly Common Assessment

Co-Teaching Kindergarten Centralization Proposal Components 2024-2025

- 2 sections of FULL day ICT (one late school, one early school)
- EXPAND second grade to 80 minutes English/80 minutes Math (currently 40 minutes English/40 minutes Math)
- Daily Common Planning Time for Special Education & General Education Teacher
- Special Education Teacher in one grade level all day
- No more than 50% of the class will have classified students (maximum number of classified students in an ICT class is 12)
- Continued professional development for teachers in fine arts and physical education-inclusive opportunity for students in the least restrictive environment in specials (teaching assistants considered for additional support when needed)
- > Psychologist FTE expanded in 2023-2024 in preparation for needed support in 2024-2025
- Consultation Support (as needed) contracted agency provider
- Transportation to centralized building locations



Co-Teaching Kindergarten Centralization Proposal - 6 Year Plan



If there are more students projected for ICT, the sections will increase, if there are less students projected for ICT, the sections will decrease. Depending on enrollment, a third building for co-teaching may be considered.




