- Physical Therapy
- Hearing Services
- Behavior Intervention Services
- Health Aide

# Teaching Assistant Assignments

- Teaching assistants will be assigned to students requiring a higher ratio of staff in school as outlined on their IEP
- Teaching assistants in classes that are split to follow social distancing guidelines will follow teacher directives for lessons and activities
- Teaching assistants will be assigned students on virtual instruction to contact and assist them with assignments weekly
- Teaching assistants will help to ensure that students adhere to social distancing and not share class materials

# Safety Precautions for In-Person ESY

- Adherence to CDC and NYS DOH Guidelines
- Provide PPE Protective Equipment
  - Masks (adults and students)
  - Shields (adults)
  - Gowns (adults)
  - Gloves (adults)
- Training for staff on proper 'donning' and 'doffing' of PPE Equipment
- Frequent hand washing and sanitizing (wiping backpacks' on arrival)
- Increased cleaning of bathrooms
- CDC Hygiene Posters for Staff and Students
- Seperate Area Designated for sick students, awaiting pick-up
- Returning to school after illness with a doctor's note





# Safety Precautions for In-Person ESY Continued

- Self-Quarantine for 14 days for those in close contact to infected student or staff member
- If there is a COVID-19 positive person attending ESY, program must be closed for at least one day to sanitize the building
- Social Distancing on Buses
- No use of common supplies (crayons, pencils) or common places (playground, lunchroom)
- Consider Temperature Checks (non-contact thermometer)
- Consider encouraging parents to drive students instead of the bus to minimize contact
- Limit contact whenever possible



# CDC Recommended Posters

**Please wear a cloth face covering.**

Maintain a distance of 6 feet whenever possible.

**Stop the Spread of Germs**

Help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases like COVID-19.

Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people.

Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands.

When in public, wear a cloth face covering over your nose and mouth.

Do not touch your eyes, nose, and mouth.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

**How to Safely Wear and Take Off a Cloth Face Covering**

**WEAR YOUR FACE COVERING CORRECTLY**

- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face
- Make sure you can breathe easily
- Do not place a mask on a child younger than 2

**USE THE FACE COVERING TO PROTECT OTHERS**

- Wear a face covering to protect others in case you're infected but don't have symptoms
- Keep the covering on your face the entire time you're in public
- Don't put the covering around your neck or up on your forehead
- Don't touch the face covering, and, if you do, clean your hands

**FOLLOW EVERYDAY HEALTH HABITS**

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others
- Avoid contact with people who are sick
- Wash your hands often, with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds each time
- Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available

**TAKE OFF YOUR CLOTH FACE COVERING CAREFULLY, WHEN YOU'RE HOME**

- Untie the strings behind your head or stretch the ear loops
- Handle only by the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine
- Wash your hands with soap and water

Cloth face coverings are not surgical masks or N-95 respirators, both of which should be saved for health care workers and other medical first responders.
